# BNR TYLER, TEXAS CHAPTER



Special Recognition to the Black Nurses Rock Tyler Texas by Smith County

Black Nurses Rock Tyler Texas will be receiving special recognition from Smith County. The County has put out a special appreciation for the efforts made by Black Nurses Rock Tyler Texas. This included efforts to coordinate, host, and volunteer in COVID-19 vaccination clinics and testing site availability. All these efforts were targeted towards increasing the number of people who have been vaccinated, which stands at 49.2% being fully vaccinated and 56.8% getting their first dose of the vaccine.

# BNR Tyler, Texas Chapter

Over 1500 people were vaccinated and given education regarding the coronavirus and also the importance of being vaccinated. This event involved the collaboration of different organizations and groups like the Tyler Area Hispanic Business Alliance, the Tyler Metro Chamber of Commerce, BNR, and the Northeast Texas Public Health District in committing to the health and well-being of the local community.

"I am very grateful for what you and your churches did for our county and for your communities in their time of need," Commissioner Hampton said. "Thank you individually and collectively for all that you do for this community."

This is to show appreciation for the effort to create more fulfilling and better lives for the community.

County Commissioners Court
has invited the Black Nurses
Rock Tyler Texas to its regular
weekly session at 9:30 a.m.
Tuesday, August 3, 2021, for

available COVID-19 testing sites
and vaccination opportunities.
